

## CATECHESIS Q & A: DEEPENING OUR KNOWLEDGE

Questions: *What are the Parts of the Mass? What do I Miss When I Come in Late? ...When I Leave Early?*


Here is a basic overview of the four parts of the Mass: the *Introductory Rites*, the *Liturgy of the Word*, the *Liturgy of the Eucharist*, and the *Concluding Rites*.

The two principal parts of the Mass are the *Liturgy of the Word* and the *Liturgy of the Eucharist*. These two form one unified act of worship. We are first nourished at the table of God's Word through the readings from Scripture, and then at the table of Our Lord's Body, which we receive in Holy Communion.

These two central parts of the Mass are flanked by two smaller parts: the *Introductory Rites* and the *Concluding Rites*. The *Introductory Rites* open the celebration of the Mass and prepare the faithful for their sacred encounter with God in His Word and in the Eucharist. So if we come in late, we are not “preparing” properly for Mass. After Communion, the

*Concluding Rites* formally close the celebration and send the people forth to do good works and take Christ into the world. Mass is not over at Communion. We must remember to kneel down after receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ and give thanks and praise to Him. Then after the Blessing, we sing joyfully together as the priest processes out.

The chart below lays out these four main sections of the Mass, which serve as an umbrella for the smaller, individual parts of the liturgy. Keeping this “big picture” of the Mass in mind will be helpful to become more faithful participants.

## **† RULES OF FAST & ABSTINENCE PER CANON LAW:**




**Abstinence** The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and over to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent in honor of the Passion of Jesus. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl. Also forbidden are soups or gravies made from them. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles and shellfish are permitted, as are animal-derived products such as margarine and gelatin which do not have any meat taste.

**Fasting** The law of fasting requires Catholics from ages 18 to 59 to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. **Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks which could be considered food (milk shakes, but not milk).

**Who is DISPENSED from fast and abstinence?**: Those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, manual laborers according to need, guests at a meal who cannot excuse themselves without giving great offense or causing enmity, and those in other situations of moral or physical impossibility.


## SAFEGUARD THE CHILDREN— "DID YOU KNOW?"
