CATECHESIS Q & A: DEEPENING OUR KNOWLEDGE

"WHAT IS HOLY WEEK AND HOW DOES IT ALL BEGIN?"

So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel! And Jesus found a young ass and sat upon it; as it is written, "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on the colt of an ass" (Jn 12:13-15).

Today we commemorate Christ's entry into Jerusalem for the completion of the Paschal Mystery. In the old calendar, before Vatican II, the Church celebrated Passion Sunday two Sundays before Easter, and then Palm Sunday began Holy Week. The Church has combined the two to reinforce the solemnity of Holy Week.

The Palm Sunday procession is formed of Christians who, in the "fullness of faith," make their own the gesture of the Jews and endow it with its full significance. Following the Jews' example we proclaim Christ as Victor: "*Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord.*" But by our faith we know, as they did not, all that His triumph stands for. He is the Messiah, the Son of God. He is the sign of contradiction, acclaimed by some and reviled by others. Sent into this world to take us from sin and the power of Satan, He underwent His Passion, the punishment for our sins, but comes forth triumphant from the tomb, the victor over death, making our peace with God and taking us with Him into the kingdom of His Father in heaven. HOLY THURSDAY - THE BEGINNING OF THE HOLY TRIDUUM

Except for the celebration of the Easter Vigil, Holy Thursday is possibly one of the most important, complex, and profound days of celebration in the Catholic Church. Holy Thursday celebrates the institution of the Eucharist as the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ and the institution of the Sacrament of the Priesthood. During the Last Supper, Jesus offers Himself as the Passover sacrifice, the sacrificial lamb, and teaches that every ordained priest is to follow the same sacrifice in the exact same way. Christ also bids farewell to His followers and prophesizes that one of them will betray Him and hand Him over to the Roman soldiers, and that one would deny Him three times.

During the night, after sundown—because Passover begins at sundown—the Holy Thursday Liturgy takes place, marking the end of Lent and the beginning of the Sacred "Triduum," (three days) of Holy Week. These days are the three holiest days in the Catholic Church. This Mass stresses the importance Jesus puts on the humility of service, and the need for cleansing with water, a symbol of baptism. Also emphasized are the critical importance of the Eucharist and the sacrifice of Christ's Body, which we now find present in the consecrated Host.

At the conclusion of the Mass, the faithful are invited to continue Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, just as the disciples were invited to stay up with the Lord during His agony in the garden before His betrayal by Judas. After Holy Thursday, no Mass will be celebrated again in the Church until the Easter Vigil celebrates and proclaims the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. {CNA - Catholic News Agency}



† RULES OF FAST & ABSTINENCE (PER CANON LAW):

Abstinence The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and over to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent in honor of the Passion of Jesus. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl. Also forbidden are soups or gravies made from them. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles and shellfish are permitted, as are animal-derived products such as margarine and gelatin which do not have any meat taste.

Fasting The law of fasting requires Catholics from ages 18 to 59 to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal on Ash Wednesday and **GOOD FRIDAY**. The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. **Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks considered food (milk shakes, but not milk).

NO FIRST FRIDAY MASS IN APRIL

Because the first Friday in April falls on Good Friday and Mass cannot be celebrated on that day, there will be **no first Friday Mass** next month. The next scheduled First Friday Mass and All-Night Vigil will be May 1, 2015, at 7:30 p.m.

Note: If you are "making the nine First Fridays" as part of your devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, you will still be able to receive Holy Communion that day at the Sacred Liturgy service.



OBITUARIES

33 AD

Jesus Christ, 33, of Nazareth, died Friday on Mount Calvary, also known as Golgotha, the Place of the Skull. Betrayed by the apostle Judas, Jesus was crucified by the Romans, by order of the Ruler Pontius Pilate. The causes of death were severe torture, extreme exhaustion, and loss of blood. Jesus Christ, a descendant of Abraham, was a member of the House of David. He was the Son of the late Joseph, a carpenter of Nazareth, and Mary, his devoted Mother. Jesus was born in a stable in the city of Bethlehem, Judea. He is survived by his mother Mary, his faithful Apostles, numerous disciples, and many other followers.

Jesus was self-educated and spent most of his adult life working as a Teacher. Jesus also occasionally worked as a doctor and it is reported that he healed many patients. Up until the time of his death, Jesus also worked feeding the hungry and helping the poor. Jesus was most noted for telling parables about his Father's kingdom and performing miracles, such as feeding over 5,000 people with only five loaves of bread and two fish, and healing a man who was born blind. On the day before he died, he held a Last Supper celebrating the Passover Feast, at which he foretold his death. His body was quickly buried in a stone grave, which was donated by Joseph of Arimathea, a loyal friend of the family. By order of Pontius Pilate, a boulder has been rolled in front of the tomb and Roman soldiers put on guard.

In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that everyone try to live as Jesus did. Donations may be sent to anyone in need.




HELP TO CLEAN THE CHURCH FOR EASTER

NATIONAL SPEAKER JESSE ROMERO TO SPEAK ON RELATIVISM


Everyone is invited to hear this talk on **Monday, April 20**, from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m., in the Parish Hall.
