

Is the Lord Calling You to Service?

We need more Liturgical Ministers for our Weekend Masses!

WHAT MASS DO YOU ATTEND? We are in serious need for more Liturgical Ministers, as follows:

- **Altar Boys:** Needed at both Sat. 5 PM & Sun. 7:30 AM and 5 PM
- **Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers:** Needed at the Sat. 5 PM, Sun. 7:30, 9, 11 AM & 5 PM
- **Lectors:** Needed at Sat. 5 PM and Sun. 9 AM, 11 AM & 5 PM
- **Sacristans:** Needed at Sat. 5 PM and Sun. 7:30 AM & 5 PM, and at the weekday Masses
- **Ushers:** Needed at ALL Masses

Liturgy means the “*work of the people.*” Good liturgy is essential for the spiritual well-being of any faith community. Good liturgy takes planning and preparation; good liturgy intentionally incorporates the varied gifts of the community, and reflects the fullness and universality of God’s Church. How do you assist at the Mass that you regularly attend? The priest cannot do it all alone, they need our help to ensure each Mass is assisted smoothly and reverently. Please consider how you give service to your Church!

Lectors: Generally speaking, a Sunday Mass requires two Lectors and the weekday Mass, one. Each A lector reads slowly, clearly and deliberately, announcing each word. Lectoring is not simply “reading”, it is proclaiming the Word of God!

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Assist the “Ordinary” (which are priests, Deacons & older Altar servers) in the distribution of Holy Communion. Since the best liturgical practice is to have Holy Communion offered under both species on Sundays, we need multiple EMs. The basic criterion for someone to serve as an Extraordinary Minister (EM) is that they need to be a Confirmed, “practicing” Catholic who is in good standing (confessed and able to also receive) and can serve with humility and reverence and be flexible if there are any changes or special needs during the Mass. Those serving as Extraordinary Ministers (E.M.) must come 15 minutes before Mass, sign-in, and check in with the Sacristan for any needs or changes. Each EM must retrieve and wear their tag. The assigned EMs come forward into the Sanctuary at the beginning of the sign of peace and stand to the side of the Altar. If serving the Cup, place the purifier on your arm. The Communion station for each EM is shown on the back of each tag. During Communion, the minister says, “The Body of Christ” or “The Blood of Christ,” clearly and with reverence when offering Communion. The number of EMs changes depending on the clergy in attendance.

It is not desirable to have people serve as both Lector and Extraordinary Minister at the same time/Mass unless absolutely necessary; it is best to understand the two roles as separate and distinct.

Ushers: The ushers serve two roles: first in welcoming the congregation with a warm smile and a kind word, and handing out bulletins at the end of Mass. They can also help people find a seat in the fuller Masses. In addition, they serve as the individuals who “handle the collection” during the offertory. They use the traditional stick-handled baskets and proceed throughout the congregation front to back, starting with the transepts. The center is not done until after the gifts are brought up. Two of the ushers also assist with the center aisle during Communion. Each Mass requires four ushers.

Sacristans: The sacristan organizes and prepares for Mass—making available the liturgical supplies needed for each Mass. This person is comfortable in finding the needed items in the sacristy of the church. Best liturgical practices dictate that all participants will arrive at least a half hour before Mass for set-up and preparations. Each Mass requires one Sacristan with two or three for larger Masses.

Altar Servers: Servers are boys in the Third Grade or higher who have made their First Holy Communion. They assist the priest at the Altar and attend regular training. The number of servers varies per Mass—from two up to seven at the larger Masses.





SCRIPTURE MEDITATION



KEEP PRAYING:
St. Monica, whose feast we celebrate in August, is often known as "the persistent mother." She watched her oldest son, Augustine, turn his back on his Christian faith. Monica was exasperated. For years she gave up talking directly to

her son on the advice of a local bishop, who told her that it was better to talk to God about Augustine than to Augustine about God. The mother never gave up praying for her son. Eventually Augustine gave up his wild ways, was baptized, and later ordained and named bishop of Hippo. St. Augustine went on to become one of the Church's greatest scholars. Today's readings address the importance of persistent prayer. Abraham, in spite of trepidation that he is bothering the Lord, continues to ask about the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah. Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, tells His disciples to "ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). This is our charge: keep praying.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Sometimes when bishops are consecrated, they are not given the care of a diocese as an "ordinary." A very old tradition, however, assures that they are invested with a "See," a link with a local church. Many hundreds of places around the world were dioceses at one time, but are no longer. In England, for example, some of the historic dioceses such as London, Salisbury, and Manchester ceased to be Catholic at the Reformation and their cathedrals passed to the Church of England. The reestablishment of the Catholic Church in the nineteenth century meant that new dioceses had to be created, such as at Liverpool and Westminster. Similarly, in Scandinavia the ancient Catholic dioceses vanished under Lutheranism. In North Africa, tiny dioceses were swept away by Islam. In the United States, some original dioceses never really developed as population centers, such as the old dioceses of Bardstown, Vincennes, Sault Ste. Marie, or Walla Walla. The tradition of "Titular Sees" assures that the ancient churches are always held in prayer, as the bishop celebrates Mass in its memory a few times a year. --Rev. James Field


