



"THE HOLY FAMILY: The School of Love"

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. The significance of the Feast becomes much more meaningful when we consider the deeper truths it reveals. Yes, it teaches us about Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. But it also speaks to each one of us how to live differently in our own families and make Jesus Christ the center of our life together. Through our Baptism, we are invited to live our lives in Him by living them in the Church, the Risen Body of Christ. The Church is the place where we learn, as the Apostle Paul reminded the Colossian Christians, to "put on love, that is, the bond of perfection" (Col. 3:14).

The Christian family is the first cell of the whole Christian Church. It is the place where we begin the journey toward holiness and learn to become more fully human. The Incarnate Word, Jesus Christ, became one of us. He was born into a human family. That was neither accidental nor incidental. There, in what the late Pope Paul VI called the *School of Nazareth*, we can learn the way of love. In every moment of His time among us Jesus was saving the world, re-creating it from within. To use a word from the early Church Father and Bishop St. Irenaeus, he was *recapitulating* the entire human experience. There, in the holy habitation of Nazareth, He forever transformed family life. Now, He teaches us how to live in His presence and learn the way of selfless love—if we will enroll in the School of Nazareth.

From antiquity the Christian family has rightly been called a *Domestic Church*. In our life within the Christian family Jesus Christ is truly present. However, we need the eyes to see Him at work, the ears to hear His instruction, and the hearts to make a place for Him to dwell. Jesus spent 30 of His 33 earthly years in Nazareth. Some spiritual writers have called these the *hidden years*, because there is so little written about them in the Gospel. However, they reveal the holiness of ordinary life and show us how it becomes extraordinary for those baptized into Christ.

In the holy habitation of Nazareth, Jesus transformed daily family life. Already blessed as God's plan for the whole human race and the first society, marriage and the Christian family has been elevated in Christ to a Sacrament, a vehicle of grace and a sign of God's presence. The Church proclaims that Christian marriage, and the family founded upon it, is a vocation, a response to the call of the Lord. St. Paul exhorted the early Christians to, "...have this mind among yourselves which was in Christ Jesus, who though He was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself" (Phil. 2:5). The Greek word for "emptied" is *kenosis*. This word refers to the voluntary pouring out of oneself in an act of sacrificial love. When the right choices are made in this life of domestic *kenosis*, we are converted. We cooperate with the Lord's invitation to follow Him by exercising our human freedom; we choose to give ourselves away in love to the other, and find ourselves made new.

In this life of responding to the Lord's invitations we are gradually transformed into an image, a living icon, of Jesus Christ, as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI reminded the faithful. This way of holiness is not easy, as anyone who has lived the vocation can attest; but make no mistake...it is a very real path to holiness. The challenge lies in the choices we make every moment. **Two trees still grow in the garden of domestic life. There is the tree in Eden where the first Eve said, "No I will not serve."** Then there is that Tree on Calvary where Mary, the Second Eve, stood with the Beloved Disciple John and, along with him, again proclaimed her YES.



Through those choices, presented to us from the moment we open our eyes every morning to the time we close them at night, we are invited to learn in the *School of Nazareth*. St. Paul wrote to the early Christians: *Brothers and sisters, Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another, and forgiving one another... And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection.* (Col. 3). The first school of prayer and practice, the place where we learn this new way of life, is the first cell of the Church, the Catholic Christian Family. Happy Feast of the Holy Family.



The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple

Today's feast is new as feasts go, and it sets us in a very modern crisis. Amid conflicting schedules and commitments, a young man has strayed from His parents and gone off to the big city. Mary and Joseph search frantically, only to find the Child Jesus in the temple, conversing with the elders and scholars of the law, who are amazed at His wisdom. It is notable that after Jesus talks of His Father's House, St. Joseph is never mentioned in the Scriptures again.

In the time of Jesus, the temple was the religious center of Jewish ritual. Outside of Jerusalem, people gathered in the synagogues, centers of learning, for daily prayer and study. Still, everyone longed to journey to the temple to participate in the offerings, and to fulfill certain obligations of the law that could only be done there. On this feast, we catch a glimpse of the family of Jesus: Parents dealing with the normal stresses of raising a child, and yet completely grounded in the ways of faith and tradition.

There has always been an appreciation in Christianity for the value of pilgrimage--the journey to holy places that is a symbol of our life's journey to God, and a sense of connection to important events in our family history. During the Christmas season, many of us undertake pilgrimages to the family homestead for festival meals, to the parishes where we were formed in the faith, or perhaps even to a beautiful manger scene or festival of lights. There are few better days than this in our calendar for spending time with the family, especially on a short pilgrimage to a favorite place. Just make sure that no one gets left behind!

ST. THOMAS BECKET (Feast: December 29)

Martyred under Henry VIII in 1535, St. Thomas More declared, "*I die the King's good servant, but God's first!*" Our featured saint, St. Thomas Becket (1118-1170), could have said the same thing four centuries earlier. As Henry II's closest friend and trusted chancellor, Becket, the King presumed, could be counted on, if made Archbishop, to deliver the Church to royal control. But Becket experienced a profound conversion, confirmed by the symbolism of the bishop as Good Shepherd and the Church as Bride of Christ. Renouncing secular responsibilities, distributing his wealth to the poor, Thomas became the Church's uncompromising champion. Faced with this "new" Becket, the King's friendship with him turned into a ferocious, almost irrational, hatred. Becket was slain before the altar of Canterbury Cathedral by royal agents, neither the first nor last good shepherd to lay down his life as the price of freedom for Christ's Church and justice for Christ's sheep.


