

The Gift of Quitting by Dani D'Angelo

I began smoking in 1960 when I was just twelve years old. By sixteen, I was given permission to smoke in the house. I am one of those people who does things in excess, so it was not long before I was smoking two packs a day. In my forties, I got breast cancer and had a mastectomy. The first thing I wanted after surgery was a cigarette. During my entire hospital stay, I spent much of my time going downstairs and outside for cigarettes. I went through eight and a half grueling months of chemotherapy but still did not quit smoking.

When I was about forty-five, I had to get by on disability with no child support for my three children. Yet, somehow, I still found the money for my cigarettes. As Christmas approached, I was flat broke and very depressed. Fortunately, one of the local churches sponsored families for Christmas, and we were picked —so my children would have presents after all. I was extremely grateful, but I was still not in a festive mood. I did not have the heart for our traditional Advent preparations that year.

On Christmas morning, my little boy asked me what I was giving the Baby Jesus for His birthday. I was crushed as I had done nothing. I had not baked our customary birthday cake for Baby Jesus, nor had we stored up our good deeds to fill the manger with straw, like in years past.


I felt bad, but the look on my son's face told me he felt worse. The next thing out of my mouth surprised even me. "I know!," I said impulsively. "I will give Baby Jesus my smoking habit. The whole thing: the cigarettes, the lighters, the cravings, the crabbiness, the ashtrays—everything about smoking is what I am giving to Baby Jesus."

He was delighted and ran to tell his sister. They were filled with such joy, while I sat stunned at what I had just done. I was obsessed with cigarettes, yet I had just told my son that I was giving up something as a gift to the Baby Jesus. Was I nuts? Could I do it? "No way," I thought. But I knew that to break such a promise to my son would haunt us both for years to come. I needed a miracle. "Look, Jesus," I prayed. "I am sorry for jumping the gun, but I made this promise to my child. Now I need you to help me keep it." Suddenly I was filled with a deep sense of sureness. The kids and I had a ball going from room to room collecting everything to do with cigarettes. There were packs hidden everywhere—five in the freezer alone!

We took the cigarettes, lighters, and ashtrays and either gave or threw them away. Then I went from room to room taking down curtains and cleaning them. I washed walls, ceilings, clothing, and everything else I could find—from Christmas morning until well into the new year. Each time I saw a smoker, I privately thanked God for taking away my habit. Then, I asked Him to do the same for the other person. I still do that to this day. I has been nine years and I have never had so much as a single craving since.

That was my Christmas miracle, and it changed my life completely. I learned that when we step out in faith, everything is possible with God, I saw firsthand what Jesus meant when He spoke

about having faith the size of a mustard seed. I gave up smoking as a gift to Baby Jesus but, in turn, it was a gift He gave to me.



COMFORT AND SALVATION

All of today's Scriptures seem to declare Christmas' "comfort and joy." Micah declares that, as small as Bethlehem is, the Child born there will bring peace that "shall reach to the ends of the earth." Hebrews proclaims that, despite pain and suffering, the "offering of the Body of Jesus Christ" saves us all. Mary, bearing the Christ Child within her, immediately, sets aside her own concerns and travels four days in haste, over dangerous terrain, from Nazareth to Ain-Karem, to assist her cousin Elizabeth. Then, just as David leapt and danced before the ancient Ark of the Covenant that bore precious signs of God's presence, so John leaps in Elizabeth's womb as Mary arrives, a living ark bearing God's living presence. Elizabeth joyfully greets Mary: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." She adds, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Likewise, we may dare hope to be "blessed" for "believing that what was spoken" to us "by the Lord"—Jesus' promise of mercy—will be fulfilled as we share God's mercy with everyone. To whom, or to what situation, do we need to bear Christ this Christmas? Indeed, throughout the year, how selflessly do we set our own concerns aside? How eagerly—"in haste"—do we, disregarding difficulties, traverse whatever dangerous terrain needs conquering to be of service to another?

Fasting from the Wound of Double-Mindedness

PAUSE TO HEAR GOD SPEAK:

"That person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord, since he is a man of two minds, unstable in all his ways."

James 1:7-8

"So submit yourselves to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you of two minds."

James 4:7-8

Today, I choose to fast from the wound of double-mindedness. Wherever you are right now, take a few seconds to look directly in front of you. Now, while still looking straight ahead, turn around and look behind you. It's impossible! You cannot look ahead and behind at the same time. Yet, this is what it feels like to be double-minded. The original Greek meaning of the term is "two selves" or "two souls." You might feel in and out, wanting and not wanting, committed and then hesitating, or wanting one thing and then another. This is an emotionally exhausting kind of confusion. We are in conflict with ourselves and unable to choose a direction. We feel unsteady. While the Scriptures encourage us to be steadfast, resolute, and to set our "face like flint" (Is 50:7), we are unable to pick a direction. Double-mindedness leaves us vulnerable to doubt and undercuts our faith. Now that we know how to recognize dm in our lives, let's take some time to reflect on how we can combat it.

Take time to ask yourself ...

When do I experience restlessness and conflict inside myself? How do I deal with being double-minded?



Pray slowly... Heavenly Father, In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, I renounce double-mindedness and repent all the ways in which I have sinned because of it, particularly the ways in which I have not drawn closer to you and have been unstable in my love for you. I reject double-mindedness in every area of my life. I renounce any lies that I have come to believe, including lies such as "I can't make up my mind" or "It won't work out anyway." I renounce any companion emotions such as confusion. Send your Holy Spirit to speak the truth to my heart that I may have the "mind of Christ" (1Cor 2:16). Amen.



"...BY THE HANDS OF ST. PAUL"

Luke gives us one more account of an outpouring of the Spirit, this time on twelve “disciples” at Ephesus in Acts 19. Many biblical scholars hold that these twelve were not actually Christians, but disciples of John the Baptist. Since they seem to have known little of Jesus, they may not actually have heard the Baptist himself, but only some of his followers who did not preach the same message as John. (John's preaching did mention Jesus and the Spirit.) When Paul realized the twelve men had not received or even heard of the Holy Spirit, he explained to them that John's baptism was preparatory to believing in Jesus. Then they were baptized, receiving the new birth in Christ. They had yet to have the Holy Spirit come upon them. It was when Paul laid his hands on them that the Spirit came upon them and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. It is clear that fr Luke, when the Spirit comes on people, there is a visible manifestation. Whether it be speaking in tongues, prophesying, praising, or preaching boldly, there always seems to be a verbal manifestation.

In Ephesus, as in every city he visited, Paul's pattern was to preach to Jews first, then to Gentiles. Luke makes the amazing statement that “this continued for two years, so that all the residents of Asia heard the word of the Lord, both Jews and Greeks” (Acts 19:10). If one were to ask how this could have happened in just two years, the next verses could be the answer: **“and God was doing extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, so that even handkerchiefs or aprons that had touched his skin were carried away to the sick, and their diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them”** (verses 11-12). this is the only reference in Acts to “extraordinary” miracles, and it gives insight into the meaning of the phrase “the hand of the Lord was with them” (Acts 11:21). This great evangelistic campaign, probably the greatest in the book of Acts, was characterized by power.

These extraordinary miracles continue today. I have witnessed them personally. I have seen people with necrotic tissue and destroyed limbs be completely healed. I have seen sight be restored to an eye that had no optic nerve, and I have seen miracles where the corneas and pupils of both eyes destroyed by muriatic acid were recreated and sight was restored. I have seen stroke victims be completely healed and paranoid schizophrenia be verifiably healed. In Mozambique God has raised people from the dead, causing whole villages to turn to Jesus, believe the Gospel, and receive Baptism (pp. 76-78).

Quiet Listening Prayer

When you come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during the rich, beautiful days of Christmas, here are some tips for a deeper encounter with the Lord Jesus:

- 1) Remind yourself that He is always trying to give you gifts and graces and, especially, to give you Himself;
- 2) Your job is try your best to receive what He is trying to give you;
- 3) Say to Him, "Lord, please help me to receive all that You want to give me right now";
- 4) During the times of silence in the Mass, just try gently breathing out more deeply from your diaphragm/belly and then breathing in slowly the Holy Name of Jesus;
- 5) If that is a total struggle and not at all enjoyable, then go to some other form of prayer that you like during the silence, e.g., after Communion, open up the missal and go back to the Mass readings and slowly start reading one of them again, until your heart engages with a particular word or phrase; or slowly begin praying a decade of the Joyful Mysteries, without worrying about whether you finish it or not.
