





Letter from Fr. Thomas, Pastor

Blessed 6th Sunday of Easter, everyone!

With encouragement from today's First Reading and Gospel, where our Lord Jesus mentions the coming of the Holy Spirit in a new way—not only through Baptism but also through the laying on of hands (Confirmation, as well as intercessory prayer by others)—we want to begin preparing for Pentecost. The first Novena to the Holy Spirit 2000 years ago began the day after Ascension Thursday, when Jesus told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem for the Promise of the Father and then, once they were clothed with Power, to then go out to Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

So, here are some references to the Holy Spirit from the Gospel of St. John, which should help you spend some time each day meditating on and starting a conversation with the Third Person of the Holy Trinity:

John 1:33; 3:6; 4:23-24; 6:63; 7:39; 14:17,26; 15:26; 16:7-11 (notice here especially the role of the Holy Spirit in helping each of us not to accept condemnation from anyone, since we are the Father's children AND since He Himself doesn't condemn anyone—only the enemy condemns! {Romans 8:1!!}); John 16:13; 19:30 (the first Pentecost/Outpouring of the Holy Spirit when Jesus died); and 20:22.

And, in case you want to pray the traditional Novena to the Holy Spirit, they will be available in English and Spanish at all the entrances to our church and in the office (prayed from May 19th through May 27; the Feast of the Ascension will be celebrated on Sunday, May 28).

Eucharistic Adoration

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

“Could you not watch one hour with me?” (Mark 14:37)



“The Eucharist is the supreme proof of the love of Jesus. Eucharistic adoration is the most necessary mission to the Church, which has even more need of prayerful souls, than of powerful preachers or men of eloquence.”

St. Pope John Paul II and Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration: On February 24, 1980, St. John Paul II issued the encyclical letter Dominicae Cenae (On the Mystery and Worship of the Eucharist). In that document he said of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration: “May our adoration never cease.” On December 2, 1981, St. John Paul II began Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in a chapel in St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome. In his opening prayer, “Stay with us, Lord,” the Pope urged all parishes to begin Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration.

Be a Committed Adorer: Make a commitment to spend an hour or more every week with Our Lord in our Adoration Chapel! Here's how: **1)** Go to <https://adorationpro.org/thereseca>; **2)** Click “Weekly Commitment”; **3)** Find the desired day/hour, click “Sign Up,” and fill out the form. You will receive an email or text reminder 24 hours before your committed time slot.

Keys to the Chapel | Security: If you have an electronic key and use the chapel after dark, please make sure you engage the lock when you enter so that the door cannot be opened without a key. Please do not let anyone whom you do not know follow you into the chapel if he/she doesn't have a key. This is an extremely important security issue.



The Real St. Therese

On August 30, 1897, after a visit from Dr. Francis La Neele, who had spoken harshly to Mother Marie de Gonzague, the latter "created a scene, lost her patience, and railed out against the whole Martin family, including Therese, but Therese remained calm." But that does not mean that the pain and the humiliation, which were often manifested by tears, were wiped out. Even though she had been a model of patience, she now uttered this cry: **"Little sisters, pray for this poor sick nun who is dying. If only you knew how little it takes to lose one's patience. I would not have believed this before."** One

evening, when she was running a very high temperature, a sister came and asked her immediate assistance with a painting. Mother Agnes (Pauline) saw her sister's struggle. That same evening, Therese wrote her the following note: **"Your little girl has been shedding more tears. Ah! this evening I showed my virtue, my TREASURES of patience! And I, who am so good at preaching to others, am glad you saw my imperfection."**

During her last illness, there were plenty of occasions when she might well have been annoyed or impatient. But she hardly ever showed it. If she did, she admitted her weakness and asked the person concerned to forgive her and pray for her. However, her interior sufferings were even more painful.

The Fourth Mansion

By St. Teresa of Avila

"In order to begin to speak of the fourth dwelling places, I really need to entrust myself, as I've already done, to the Holy Spirit and beg Him to speak for me from here on, that I may say something about the remaining rooms in a way that you will understand. For supernatural experiences begin here. These are something most difficult to explain. ...Since these dwelling places now are closer to where the King is, their beauty is great. There are things to see and understand so delicate that the intellect is incapable of finding words to explain them, although something might turn out to be well put and not at all obscure to the inexperienced; and anyone who has experience, especially when there is a lot of it, will understand very well. It will seem that to reach these dwelling places, one will have had to live in the others a long while. Although it is usual that a person will have to have stayed in those already spoken about, there is no certain rule, as you will have often heard. For the Lord gives when He desires, as He desires, and to whom He desires. Since these blessings belong to Him, He does no injustice to anyone (1, 1-2)."
