

# The Pastor's Letter

Dear Parishioners of St. Therese,

We continue our journey in learning more about our patroness. We now come to the famous story from her childhood about the “Virgin of the Smile.” This was a very significant moment in her life that healed her and shaped her maturation and faith development for the rest of her life. The actual statue of Our Lady of the Smile stands to this day at the Carmelite monastery in Lisieux where St. Therese lived. —Fr. Peter Mary, O.C.D.



## MANUSCRIPT A, 29v-31v (Introduction)

### “The Smile of the Virgin”

#### Introduction to the text:

Let us repeat what we already said in the first work sheet about the “miraculous statue of the Blessed Virgin”—the “Virgin of the Smile.” The Martin-Guérin spouses had a particular devotion to this image, which plays an essential role in Therese’s life, curing her of her serious childhood nervous disease and accompanying her in her agony in the infirmary (beginning July 8, 1897). In January 1895, it was in the antechamber of Therese’s cell.

This statue had been offered to the young Louis Martin by a very pious old woman from Alençon who was confident that she had found in him a person worthy of receiving such a gift. As a bachelor, Louis placed the statue in his gazebo, where he used to retire to read and pray. After he married, the statue became the center of family prayer and, during Mary’s month, she was surrounded by flowers. Often, Zèlie Martin, Louie’s wife, turned to the Blessed Virgin, confessing that she had received “favors that only I know.” In Les Buissonnets (the name of the Martins’ house in Lisieux where the family moved after Zèlie’s death when Therese was four years old), the statue continued to occupy a prominent place.

Therese also prayed to Our Lady under the title of our Lady of Victories: a devotion and sanctuary much loved by the Martins. A novena of Masses was celebrated at the sanctuary in Paris for the healing of Therese as a child. On her journey to Rome, Therese visited this church on November 4, 1887, along with her father and sister Celine, and received a calming grace.

“Marie obtained what she wanted”: This is how Marie of the Sacred Heart (her sister Marie) recalled this scene: “The most terrible crisis was the one that most counted in her Life. I thought she was going to succumb to her illness. Seeing her exhausted, I wanted to give her a drink, but she screamed in terror,

‘They want to poison me!’ It was then that I threw myself with my sisters at the feet of the Blessed Virgin. Three times I repeated the same prayer. The third time, I saw Therese staring fixedly at the statue of the Blessed Virgin... The Virgin’s Ray did not act all at once, but sweetly and gently it raised the little flower and strengthened her....” Therese’s sisters have confirmed that this serious nervous disease left no after-effects, apart from two small alerts, reported by her sister Leonie.

“My happiness was going to disappear and change into bitterness”: a strong word for Therese, who uses the word “bitterness” thirty-two times in her Manuscripts and letters. It evokes in transparency the bitterness of Christ’s chalice.

“Humiliation is becoming my lot”: Therese’s particularly strong expression shows that the humiliation she experienced was without compensation, perhaps more harshly than at other times in her life, and at a tender age (ten years old).



# Small Change to Mass and Confession Schedule

After discernment, discussion and agreement in our community of friars here at St. Therese, we have decided to restore **Wednesday Confession hours from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.**, and to no longer offer a Mass on Wednesday evenings. The first Wednesday that this will be implemented will be **September 6th**. For the Mass intentions which have already been scheduled for the evening Mass on Wednesdays (September 6 and after), be assured that these intentions will be offered at Mass, albeit privately by one of our priests in residence.



Also, as published last week, **confessions times on Saturday are now from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.**, (NOT until 6:00 p.m.) so that the focus will be on the celebration of the Mass at 5:00 p.m. Also, all confessions will be heard inside the confessional in the church.



**Apparitions in Fatima by Our Lady—July 18, 1917 ~ The fourth apparition:** The children were imprisoned in the house of the local Administrator and not released until August 16, three days after the apparition date. On August 13, there was a crowd of 18,000 at the Cova da Iria and, though the children were not there, the sun grew pale and the atmosphere became a sickly yellow color. A cloud appeared and hovered over the holm oak where Our Lady had



appeared to the children. On August 19, after the children were released, Our Lady appeared to the children in a pasture, away from the usual site of the apparitions. She asked them to, “Pray, pray very much, and make sacrifices for sinners. For many souls go to Hell because there is no one to pray for them.”

**September 13, 1917 ~ The fifth apparition:** A luminous globe appeared before the crowd at the Cova while the three children remained hidden in a cloud. White rose petals fell from the sky and reached almost to the ground and then disappeared. Lucy asked Our Lady to cure the sick. She replied, “Some will be cured, but not all because Our Lord has no confidence in them.” Our Lady told them that St. Joseph and the Child Jesus would be with her on October 13th.

## The Real St. Therese

The *Last Conversations* reveal that simplicity and frankness that Bernanos describes so well in *Les Enfants Humiliés*: "There are saints who absolutely cannot speak of the other side without lifting their voices. These saints, I suppose, one day must have given up a part of themselves that they did not think was so precious, that they probably thought was too human, and which they were not able to regain, even at the price of countless sacrifices..."

Therese belongs with those saints who have never lost that fundamental part of themselves—their childhood, their zest for life. The love of nature has always been a characteristic trait of Therese's personality: "I loved the countryside, the flowers and the birds so much." We must not forget that she spent the first twelve months of her life at Semalle, nourished by the milk of the quick-witted Rose Mille, and that her early years had been profoundly influenced by that sojourn in the country.

In the infirmary, this side of Therese's character was thrown into relief. When her bed was still in the corner, she leant over to admire the sunset. She rejoiced to see the stars and the sky. On Saturday, August 28, her bed was turned round so that she could see the garden. "Oh! how happy I am!" She was able to admire the red Virginia creeper. When she saw the fruit that she loved, she showed a childlike joy. She liked especially grapes, plums, and peaches because of their soft skin: "I get so much pleasure out of touching fruit, especially peaches, and I like to see them near me."


# Carmelite Mission, Uganda


