

WHO IS CARDINAL BURKE: Cardinal Raymond Leo Burke is an American prelate of the Catholic Church and the patron of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta. He served as the bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse, Wisconsin, from 1995 to 2003; and as the archbishop of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, Missouri, from 2003 to 2008. Burke's previous position was Cardinal

Prefect of the Supreme Tribunal of the Apostolic Signatura, which he held until November 2014. On September 26, 2015, the Vatican announced that Burke had been reappointed to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, from which he had been removed in December 2013. As a prominent canon lawyer, Burke is often perceived as a voice of traditionalism and orthodoxy among prelates of the Catholic Church.


Burke was born on June 30, 1948, in Wisconsin, the youngest of six. From 1962 to 1968, he attended Holy Cross Seminary in La Crosse, Wisconsin, and from 1968 to 1971, The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1970 and a Master of Arts degree in 1971, both in philosophy. He completed studies for the priesthood at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome between 1971 and 1975, receiving both a Bachelor of Sacred Theology and a Master of Arts degree. Pope Paul VI ordained Burke to the priesthood on June 29, 1975, at Saint Peter's Basilica.

After his ordination to the priesthood, Burke was assigned as assistant rector of the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in La Crosse, Wisconsin. He also taught religion at Aquinas High School in La Crosse. From 1980 to 1984, Burke studied canon law at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, where he received a licentiate in canon law in 1982 and a doctorate in canon law in 1984. He then returned to La Crosse where he was named the Moderator of the Curia and Vice Chancellor of the La Crosse diocese. In 1989, St. Pope John Paul II named Burke the first American Defender of the Bond of the Supreme Tribunal of the Apostolic Signatura, the highest ecclesiastical court in the Catholic Church. On November 20, 2010, Pope Benedict XVI elevated Burke to the College of Cardinals. On February 5, 2011, the memorial of St. Agatha, Burke took canonical possession of his titular church in Rome, Sant'Agata dei Goti.

WHAT IS A CARDINAL OF THE CHURCH? A cardinal is a senior ecclesiastical leader, considered a Prince of the Church, who is an ordained bishop of the Roman Catholic Church. The Church originated the term and the title around the end of the 4th century. The "red hat" that serves as the "badge of office" emerged a bit later. Cardinals are immediately below the Pope in the hierarchy of the Church. Their main responsibility is to elect a new pope. The word cardinal can be traced back to the Latin, *cardinalis*, which meant "serving as a hinge" (the root of this word is *cardo*, meaning "hinge"). There was a time when these Church officials had great power and many of society's norms and laws "hinged" on their decisions. The reason why they began dressing in red was as a reminder that they would do anything for the Church, including shedding their own blood. The bird known as "the Cardinal" was named in honor of the clergymen, some time after Columbus discovered America, because of its bright red color.

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH

The Church has long encouraged devotion to St. Joseph, the spouse of Mary and the foster father to Jesus. To honor him and ask for his powerful intercession, we will celebrate a special Mass for the Solemnity of St. Joseph on Monday, March 20, at 7:30 p.m. (moved from his normal feast day on the 19th since it falls on a Sunday). Please join us in honoring St. Joseph, the patron of the Discalced Carmelite Order.





Rhonda Storey, 284-0020, Ext. 225 In order to take part in our Baptism Program, **PARENTS & GODPARENTS** are required to attend a class from 7:30 to 9:00 p.m., in the Parish Library (next are April 6 and May 4—none in March). The fee is \$100 per child OR \$25 for the class only. Baptisms are on Saturdays (next open are February 18 AND April 29) at 11:00 a.m.

SELECTING THE GODPARENTS: Canon Law requires you to have at least one godparent (may have two) who: 1) is at least 16; 2) has been Confirmed; and 3) is a practicing Catholic. A form attesting to this need to be signed by a priest from the parish of each prospective godparent.
