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

Throughout our salvation history are many stories of how to stay in the truth that God is God and God alone. He is our surety.

In our first reading we heard how God's holy city, Jerusalem, fell. The young King Jehoiachin did evil in the sight of the Lord. It was a lingering evil built up through his forebears, who had built their house on sand. This, the Babylonian exile, occurred in 576 B.C., when Jerusalem was conquered by the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar. An additional wave of exile reoccurred ten years later.



A LITTLE ABOUT THE CARMELITE NUNS WHO LIVE IN GEORGETOWN, CALIFORNIA

The community of Carmelite Nuns in Georgetown was originally sited in Sacramento, California, when they were founded in 1935. The then-Bishop of Sacramento inquired of them what would be needed for the initial establishment of the monastery. Mother Seraphine replied, "Excellency, St. Teresa felt that to begin a monastery a house and bell were necessary. Bishop, we have the bell."

The first Mass of this new foundation took place at midnight on Christmas Eve, 1935, in a farm house. The scene of Mary and Joseph in a cave, awaiting the birth of Jesus, blended so well with that moment. And the new community experienced a poverty not unlike that known to Mary, Joseph, and Jesus; a poverty they rejoiced in for several years, until the end of our country's "Great Depression."

Fifty years later, they relocated to Georgetown, where Fr. Matthias just spent his retreat. Their address indicates not only the location of their monastery but also the goal of their community. After the nuns settled in their first house in Sacramento, Mother Mary Seraphine wrote to Mother Agnes at the Lisieux Carmel and entreated her to ask her sainted blood sister, St. Thérèse, to obtain from God the favor that all who would be called to this new Carmel would be Victims of Merciful Love—as was St. Thérèse. When the community ultimately moved to Georgetown in the El Dorado Forest in 1981, they received their new address of 6981 Teresian Way. They wondered, "Why such a long number..." since they were the only ones living on that street. After some prayerful reflection, they realized that St. Thérèse made her oblation to Merciful Love on *June 9*, and that '81 was the year the address was assigned to them, so 6981 echoes their vocation.

Join us for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the main body of the Church as follows:

*DAYS/HOURS Monday through Friday from 6:00 am to 9:00 pm; Saturdays from 6:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

*Note:

The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during any Mass; that is, funerals, weddings, etc., meaning that there will be no adoration during those times.

Please help us to keep Our Lord accompanied at every hour during Adoration in the church! Just go to the website, https://adorationpro.org/ThereseCA and click on WEEKLY COMMITMENT to view the schedule and to sign up.

When you enter your name on a time slot, it means you are **COMMITTING** to adoring Jesus in our church at that same time on that same day **EVERY week**. It's unlimited as to how many can sign up for each hour. You will be sent automatic reminders beforehand.

Once you've arrived to the church for your hour, check-in by using your Smartphone (or use the kiosk once it's installed in the church) to visit the site and click **ADORER SIGN IN**. Then click Scheduled Adorer Sign In and select your name and then confirm it. IF your name does not appear, you are either not scheduled for that hour or you arrived too late or too early.

Finding substitute adorers to take your place is super easy. If you cannot attend a particular week, go to the site to find a sub or invite a friend to take your place. The current password is subpass. If your schedule changes and you can no longer commit
