Letter from Fr. Thomas, Pastor


Jesus is risen! Blessed Easter Week Three, everyone!



French Boys' Choir

St. Therese Church will host the French Boys' Choir from Paris, France (Les Petits Chanteurs de France) on Thursday, April 27, at 7:00 p.m., in the Church (Mass will take place at 6:00 p.m.) These children have been singing and travelling in France and all over the world for nearly ten years and are now touring the Southwest U.S.

This choir of 20 passionate boys and teenagers, from 8 to 18 years old, is conducted by Veronique Thomassin-Olivier, and accompanied by François Olivier, who is also the Titular of the Choir Organ at the prestigious church St. Eustache at Paris.

Their repertoire includes music from the sixteenth century to the present day, including the Hallelujah chorus from Handel's Messiah and Ave Maria from Gounod, as well as music pieces from French folklore. The choir will be available after the concert to sell their latest CD.



HOUSING FOR THE BOYS' CHOIR

This choir, which sings all over the world for humanitarian purposes, is in need of one-night's housing. There are fifteen boys and teenagers from eight to eighteen years of age, the bus driver (60 years old) who has traveled with us the last ten years and is a full member of the choir; one married couple and their ten year old daughter. The boys and teens have to be hosted by a minimum of pairs, and they can share a bed if necessary. None has any allergies or special diets. The children are very adaptable and are used to staying with many families. Call the office if you can house two or more (626-282-2744, ext. 0).

The Real St. Therese

When the hemoptysis began, she was reassured and rejoiced: "At last, I could give him the impression that I'm really sick. Never shall I forget the scene this morning when I was coughing up blood. Dr. de Corniere had a puzzled look." On July 8, some thought it time to administer the Last Sacraments: "I fear only one thing: that all this will change." It was a justifiable fear. "I want to be anointed very much; let them laugh at me afterwards if they want to" (she knew that some of the sisters did not think she was in danger of death). It was not only some of the sisters, but the superior of the Carmel himself. Yet in fairness to him, we must emphasize that Therese, because of the efforts she made not to sadden those around her, hardly presented the image of someone at death's door. Canon Maupas said to her: "Oh! You're only trying to mislead us. You're not going to die; very soon you'll be running in the garden. You don't look like a person who is dying. Give you Extreme Unction? But the sacrament wouldn't be valid. You're not sick enough!" Therese became prey to doubts, and this is a more subtle form of suffering. Perhaps she was mistaken and had deceived everyone: "It came into her head that she wasn't seriously ill, that the doctors were mistaken about the state of her health. She told me (Mother Agnes) about these trials and added: 'But these changes only touch the surface of my soul . . . Ah! nevertheless, they are great trials!'"

It must be admitted that the progress of the disease threw outsiders off the scent, since it amazed the doctor himself. Three days after she was taken down to the infirmary, Dr. de Corniere seems to have shared Canon Maupas' opinion. He found her "better than usual" ... Therese informed the family of these sudden improvements: "Tell them ... that I'm a child of contradiction. They think I am dying, and I don't faint away; then they think I'm alive and I'm on the threshold of death. I am a real contradiction." On July 13 she was sure that her Spouse was at the door and had only a few more weeks to live. She reminded the Guerins of the paradox: "One day Dr. de Corniere looks so dismayed that I think I am at Heaven's gate, and the next day he goes off quite happy, saying: 'Why, you're on the road to recovery.'"

At the end of July there were fresh doubts: "I'm not about to die. It's too bad if no one can any longer understand anything." Therese grew somewhat tired of the frequent discussion and the morbid game of prognosis which often took place in her presence as to when she was going to die. In August the uncertainty continued. No one could any longer understand the progress of the sickness. She herself had misgivings about her imminent death. Like Robinson Crusoe on his island, she could not see the ship that she had been told was coming to save her: "I said to myself: 'They've deceived me! I'm not going to be leaving!'" **Continues next week, space permitting.**

The Interior Castle: The Fourth Mansion

Let them take the advice that, when they feel this languishing in themselves, they tell the prioress and distract themselves from it insofar as they can. The prioress should make them give up so many hours for prayer so that they have only a very few and try to get them to sleep and eat well until their natural



strength begins to return, if it has been lost through a lack of food and sleep. If a Sister's nature is so weak that this is not enough, may she believe me that God does not want her to practice anything but the active life, which also must be practiced in monasteries. They should let her get busy with different duties; and always take care that she not have a great deal of solitude, for she would lose her health completely. It will be quite a mortification for her; in how she bears this absence is the way the Lord wants to test her love for Him. And He will be pleased to give her strength back after some time. If He doesn't, she will gain through vocal prayer and through obedience and will merit what she would have merited otherwise, and perhaps more (12-13).
