

# etter from Fr. Thomas, Pastor Jesus is risen! Blessed Fifth Sunday of Easter, everyone!

We are continuing to grow in our baptismal identity during this Easter season, and the unity in difference in the Lord Jesus that flows from that. "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free...for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal 3:28).

And so, we are having a MINISTRY FAIR today (in front of the church after the morning Masses), and again in two weekends (May 21st), to help you to get more familiar with the various ministries available in our Parish. We are also having a

CALLED TO RENEW reception today (see bottom of page), to give you a chance to become more familiar with our Archdiocesan and Parish Capital Campaign and to consider making a gift or pledge.

Today, our Lord Jesus promises us Heaven: "I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:3). Below are some thoughts by Dr. Peter Kreeft on "Heaven":

Fraternally in Jesus and Mary and Joseph, —Fr. Thomas of the Trinity, OCD


"Is Heaven Serious or Funny? The very distinction is too funny to take seriously. The distinction between humor and seriousness is strictly earthly. Here on earth, much humor is "comic relief" from the grim business of "real" life. But in Heaven, humor is high seriousness. It is the inner secret of God and the blessed. Even on earth, saints play with their lives in the most outrageous way. St. Thomas More ended his life with a bad joke, telling the axman, "Please do not chop my beard in two; IT has not committed treason." Jesus has the most perfect sense of humor of all. We do not often see it, because we think of humor as jokes. But the most perfect humor is in the very situation itself, especially irony, the contrast between appearance and reality. "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone" at her is irony. It could be more clumsily and directly rendered, "You judgmental fools are worse than that adulteress—taking out splinters with logs in your eyes." It is the same irony as Pilate's "What is truth?," as Truth stands in front of him.

Jesus is our best indicator of Heaven, and if there is humor in Jesus, there is humor in Heaven. Jesus is the manifestation of the Father, and if there is humor in the personality of the Son, there is humor in the personality of the Father. For some reason, people think of the Persons of the Trinity as lacking personality, as nebbishes. In fact, the three fullest personalities in all reality are the Father, the Son, and the Spirit. They are characters! They designed ostriches, for goodness' sake (literally). And—supreme joke—us. Many of the resuscitated perceive and share Heavenly humor, even God's laughter at repented and forgiven sins. We can laugh only when we are free, detached. The saint can laugh at life in his martyrdom, and once freed from sin (but not until then), we can laugh even at sin in Heaven. Detachment is necessary for humor. And in Heaven there is perfect detachment, even from self (ek-stasis, "standing-outside-oneself"). Therefore, in Heaven there is perfect humor.

The saint and the clown share the secret of levity, the union between the two meanings of "light": truth (opposite of falsehood and darkness) and levity (opposite of gravity and heaviness). Saints levitate! Body follows spirit. But Heavenly humor is not the opposite of seriousness, only of joyless seriousness. Saints, mystics, and the resuscitated take life more seriously than others do. Everything gains an infinite importance, an "eternal weight of glory". Joy is a serious matter—too good to be wasted on jokes. The saint does not usually tell jokes, because he does not need to, to relieve the joylessness, to relieve sadness, to distract from the heavy, practical world. ## The Flame of Love: The Greatest Gift of Grace for Our Time



Essential Prayer #3 - The Flame of Love Hail Mary: Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with Thee, blessed are Thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of Thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, spread the effect of grace of Thy Flame of Love over all of humanity, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Many people feel uncomfortable at the beginning of this practice to include the Flame of Love petition in the Hail Mary, until we understand that this has come from Our Blessed Mother through her Son and is her gift for us at this crucial time. When a bishop asked why this should be done, Jesus explained, "Because of the Holy Virgin's efficacious pleas, the Most Blessed Trinity granted the outpouring of the Flame of Love. For her sake, you must place this prayer in the Hail Mary" (February 2, 1982). "Through this prayer, Satan will be blind, and souls will not be led into sin." Our Lady said: "Whoever prays three Hail Mary in honor of My Flame of Love delivers a soul from Purgatory. Whoever prays one Hail Mary in honor of My Flame of Love during the month of November, delivers 10 souls from Purgatory."



We must not forget those "pinpricks" which, either directly or indirectly through a second person, still wounded St. Therese while she was in the infirmary. She was not unaware that "certain sisters did not share the sentiments of the

'Martin clan'". On May 19, 1897, she confided that she felt these "little pains very sharply" and told Mother Agnes of some painful humiliations certain sisters had given her. Certain conversations were repeated to her; for instance, she was told that Sister Saint-Vincent de Paul, dis-edified at Therese's refusal to take some broth, had said to another nun: "Sister Therese of the Child Jesus is NO saint!; she is not even a good religious." Another sister came and said to her: "If you only knew how little loved and appreciated you are here!" The humiliation was then redoubled by the cruel naïvete of the one who had relaved those words to her! And above all, there was Mother Marie de Gonzague's difficult temperament, which must have tried Therese most. Mother Agnes has left us this incident: "On several occasions, Therese was made to feel Mother's jealousy, which flared up because the novices often went to the infirmary to visit Therese. Just a few days before she died, Mother Marie de Gonzague spoke to her so coldly and made her visits so brief that Sister Therese of the Child Jesus asked one of the novices: "Do you know what I have done to upset our Mother?" "I know," replied the novice, "I did not wish to tell you, lest I caused you pain. Our Mother has noticed that I love you very much and that I am very happy when I can come and see you. She said to me: "If I had known of your close ties with Sister Therese of the Child Jesus and how she suffices for you in everything, I would not have worried about you." Sister Therese of the Child Jesus replied simply to the novice, "Ah! That's the reason! Thank you."

# The Seasonal Marian Hymns Used at Mass Alma Redemptoris | Ave, Regina Caelorum | Regina Caeli | Salve Regina



Ever wonder why and when we change from using one of the above four hymns to another at the end of our Sunday Masses? It's a very traditional Carmelite practice going back to the 12th Century. Here's how it works: Alma Redemptoris (#85 in our Pew Missal) is sung from the First Sunday of Advent through the Feast of the Purification, known as Candlemas, on February 2. Ave Regina Caelorum (# 96 in our Pew Missal) is sung from the Sunday after Candlemas until the Easter vigil. Regina Caeli (# 234) is sung from Easter Sunday until Pentecost Sunday, which this year is May 28. Then we switch to Salve Regina (# 236) from the Sunday after Pentecost, which is Most Holy Trinity

Sunday, until just after Thanksgiving when Advent begins. Then, just to throw us off a bit, especially on July 16, the Feast day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, the priests may decide to sing the "Flos Carmeli," which is Latin for "Flowers of Carmel" written by the 13th century Carmelite, St. Simon Stock. You can see the lyrics (but not the notes) in the front of your pew Missal. One nice feature you may have noticed in that handy Pew Missal is that all of the songs are in alphabetical order, so if you didn't hear the song number announced, you can easily find it.


